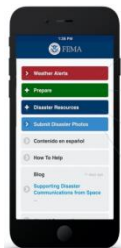

Note: You must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or a qualified alien to qualify for a grant from FEMA’s Individuals and Households Program. However, undocumented individuals can apply on behalf of a minor child who is a citizen and has a social security number. Other Individual Assistance programs such as Crisis Counseling, Disaster Legal Services are available regardless of citizenship status.
